## RATIONALE

Parents are the child's first educator. It is our responsibility to try and ensure that all parents have the opportunity to feel that they are regarded as partners in their child's education.

## <u>AIMS</u>

- To increase parents understanding of their child's education.
- To encourage parents to transmit positive attitudes to children about school.
- To present a set of consistent attitudes/standards of work and behaviour between home and school.
- To encourage parental involvement in classrooms and around school.
- To improve the quality of help given by parents at home and in school.

## We aim to encourage parents to become involved by:-

- Holding regular parents evenings
- Teaching staff making themselves available for informal discussions with parents in the playground, before and after school.
- Inviting parents to assemblies and multi-faith celebrations.
- Involving parents in helping with the life of school.
- Holding parents workshops in conjunction with Family Learning.
- Encouraging parents to support fund raising initiatives.
